For good reason, Bishop Remi became known as one of the most dynamic and forward-looking members of the hierarchy in North America. He stood up for the active functioning of the laity, the role of women in the Church, and the poor and vulnerable everywhere. In the development of a local Synod, he implemented Vatican II in his diocese of Victoria.

The Council was, of course, only the opening of the Church. The work of fully implementing the seminal ideas will take many years. Bishop Remi has displayed patience as not the least of the virtues he brings to enlarging public understanding of what it means to be part of the People of God. In his "retirement" years, he has not slowed down as he continues his lectures and workshops throughout North America, Europe and China. Sturdy, dauntless, loving, Bishop Remi De Roo has made a contribution to the Church in Canada of historic proportions.

## From the desk of our Chaplain

Dear Brother Knights,

For this Lenten message I'd like to share with you few short excerpts from Benedict XVI's messages for Lent since occupying the chair of Peter. I hope this will provide you with some inspiration for making many good resolutions for this season of Lent:

+ May every family and Christian community use well this time of Lent, in order to cast aside all that distracts the spirit, and grow in whatever nourishes the soul, increasing love for God and neighbour. I am thinking especially of a greater commitment to prayer, *lectio divina*, recourse to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and active participation in the Eucharist, above all Sunday Mass. (2009)

+ Fasting certainly brings benefits to physical well-being, but for believers, it is, in the first place, a "therapy" to heal all that prevents them from conformity to the will of God. (2009)

+ Lent offers us a providential opportunity to deepen the meaning and value of our Christian lives, and it spurs us to rediscover the mercy of God so that we, in turn, become more merciful toward our brothers and sisters. (2008)

+ We are not owners but rather administrators of the goods we possess: these, then, are not to be considered as our exclusive possession, but the means through which the Lord calls each one of us to act as a steward of His providence for our neighbour. (2008)

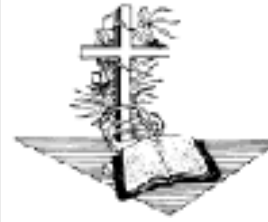
+ Lent is a favourable time to learn to stay with Mary and John, the beloved disciple, close to him who on the Cross, consummated for all mankind, the sacrifice of his life (cf. *John* 19: 25). (2007)

+ Throughout history, even when hate seems to prevail, the luminous testimony of His love is never lacking. To Mary, "the living fount of hope" (Dante Alighieri, *Paradiso*, XXXIII, 12), we entrust our Lenten journey, so that she may lead us to her Son. (2006)

## Tribute to Bishop Remi De Roo on his 85th Birthday

Bishop **Remi De Roo** is one of the last living Fathers of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65), the most momentous event of the Catholic Church in the 20th century. On October 31, 1962, he was called by Pope John XXIII, the originator of the Council, to be a bishop and thus took part in the preparation of the Council's 16 documents, which brought the Church into the modern world.

On four occasions, Bishop Remi addressed the Council. The main focus of his interventions was on:

- +The unity of the divine creative and redemptive plan.
- +The one vocation of all believers concerning both spiritual and temporal matters.
- +The sacramental character of family life and conjugal intimacy.
- +The one calling of the ordained ministerial priesthood.
- +Religious freedom and ecumenism.
