Dear Brothers,

Last Wednesday, Feb.25th, the Church celebrated the start of the holy season of Lent, during which we are encouraged to make changes to our lives. It is "a softening up" period which helps us to understand that God, not we, is our "Light and Salvation." It is a time to once again renew our efforts to forgive, to ask for forgiveness, and to seek reconciliation with one other. To forgive and ask forgiveness may be radical to our society, but is central to our faith! The grace of Lent will be precisely God's gift of courage and fortitude to carry this through.

May 16, 2004, is the 50th anniversary of the founding of our Council. We have planned a day of celebration for Saturday, May 15, 2004, which will include Mass at St.Peter's and a banquet thereafter at Cavallotti Hall here in Nanaimo. As your Grand Knight, I am appealing to all our members to support this 'once in a life time' event. This is an opportunity for all of us to show our solidarity with those Knights who founded our Council, and who have gone before us sharing our Founder's ideal of giving service to Church and community. In the next few days you will receive a letter asking if you and your spouse plan to attend, and to please let us know your decision by April 15th. The price of tickets for the banquet is \$22.00 per person, which will include wine for the toasts, door prizes, etc.

There is still a lot of work to be done, but with your support, I am convinced we can make this very important day in the life of our Council a successful and memorable one.
