2022 Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities

On Jan. 11, 2023, the **2022 Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities** was submitted to the Supreme, State and District deputies. This report consists of a list of activities our Council was involved in, the number of hours volunteered during the year, total council activity expenses, and total charitable (church, community/needy, youth) disbursements.

Here is a brief summary of those disbursements: Church, \$300; family \$2500; community/needy, \$4,357; youth, \$3,502; life issues, \$1,450 for a total of **\$12,109**. In addition, we also spent a total of **\$1,557** on council activities. The number of hours dedicated to volunteer charitable and fraternal services were as follows: Church, 694 hours; family, 353 hours; community, 945 hours; youth, 302 hours, and life activities, 25 hours for a total of **2017 hours**.

Congratulations and a sincere thank you to all the Brothers who participated and volunteered throughout the past year in any and all of our activities. You are an example of what the Knights are all about; a living proof that, by volunteering, we can make a difference both in the parish and the larger community. Our thanks also goes out to Bros. **Hans Fadum,** and **Guy Doiron** for supplying all the financial information, and for collecting the volunteer statistics—thank you!
